Gold Star Post #1365: Minutes of July 12th 2025

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 by Commander Frank Saladis, the roll call was taken and noted. A motion by Bruce Lieberman to accept the minutes of the June meeting as printed and distributed was seconded and passed. Paul Dietrich provided the treasurer's report as of June 2025, the details were provided but will not be published, and presently \$845 has been donated by members for the National Emergency Fund. Any member wishing to see the details should contact Paul. New Member, US Army veteran Miguel Cortez was introduced. The property survey issue is still on hold. The construction of the battery facility is on hold and Assemblyman Sam Pirozzolo is fronting the issue. Membership: Paul Dietrich reports that membership cards are in and to see him to renew. multiyear renewals must be done online. Commander Saladis reported on the proposed budget and that it was approved by the Post executive committee. Commander Saladis also stated that all expenses must be approved and properly tracked. Children & Youth: the next event will be the Halloween Trunk or Treat, volunteers are needed. Commander Saladis reported that the cost of renting the carousel for two hours is \$600 and that a BBQ back at the post would be the most costeffective way to proceed. Commander Saladis is looking for way to get community involvement to showcase what we do, like an ice cream "Sunday" for children and the post would provide ice cream Sundays for them. Boys State: a thank you not from one of the boys was printed in the newsletter. Frank Peters reported that the Auxiliary met on Monday June 30th for the first time. Maryann Stallone is president and addressed membership. The Auxiliary members cleaned the entire Post from top to bottom on July 3rd for the July 4th function. The next meeting will be the last Monday of the month at 10:00 AM. Sick Call: Harold Bregman is home and recuperating. Gene Guerra reported on Independence Day next year and that the cost of running the annual parade is in the tens of thousands of dollars. Commander Saladis reported the Bell Jar is on the second game and half way through the 4 thousand tickets. The issue of cold war veterans receiving the wartime property tax exemption has been placed on hold by the NYC Council, and will be brought up at the political forum in October. A motion by Paul Dietrich to add \$165 to the money donated by members so that the total donation to the NEF will be \$1015 was seconded and passed. Frank LaMarsh reports the annual pig roast will be held on September 20th starting at noon. The cost is \$35 for members and veterans and \$45 for guests. Commander Saladis spoke about the need to adhere to the Post constitution and bi-laws and running the post as it should be. Every Wednesday from noon till 1 PM is the free chair Yoga. Paul Cempa reports Post shirts and hats are available and looking into possibly getting lighter jackets. A motion by Frank Peters to adjourn was seconded and approved. The meeting was closed at 11:44.
